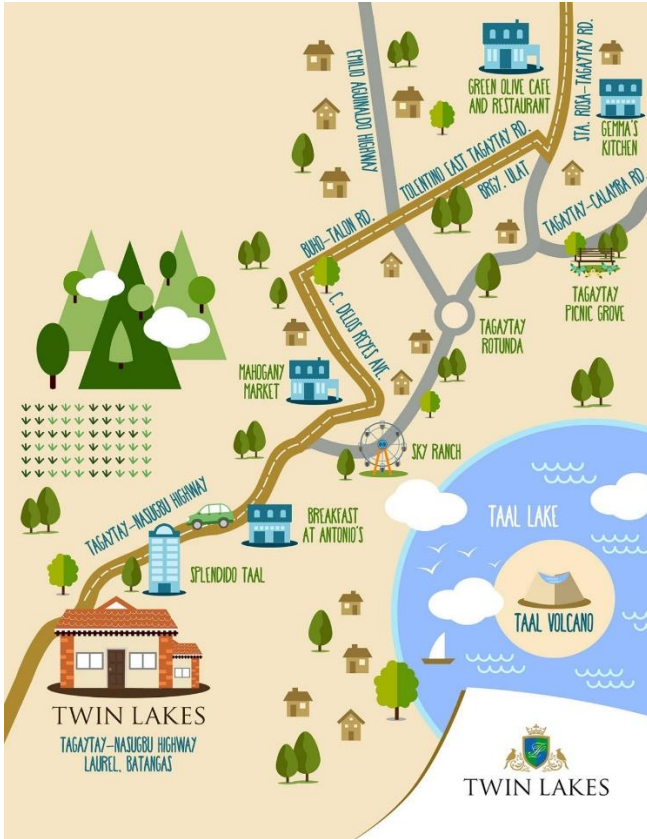

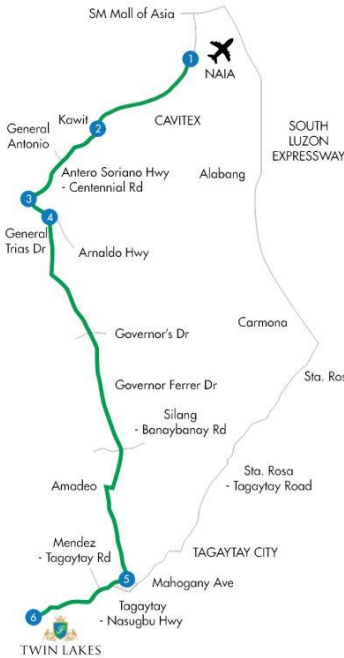
CONVENTION VENUE MAP AND TRANSPORTATION GUIDE

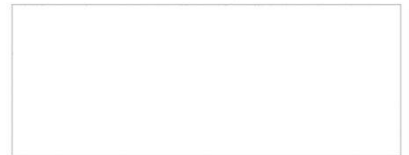

Twin Lakes is just 1.5 hours away from Manila. It is accessible through several exits along the South Luzon Expressway. It is located along Tagaytay-Nasugbu Road, Brgy. Dayap Itaas, Laurel, Batangas.

How to get there:

a. For private transportation

Driving to Tagaytay City via private car is easy and convenient. Drive through South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) then exit at Sta. Rosa Exit. From there, it's a straight drive going to Tagaytay. You can refer to the above maps or get help from waze and other navigation app.

b. For public transportation

Most buses going to Twin Lakes from Manila are stationed in Pasay, Cubao and Buendia LRT Taft. The travel time from Manila to Tagaytay is around 2 to 3 hours, with a minimum of Php 100.00 fare, depending on the bus company (BSC, DLTB, Erjohn, JAM, San Augustin). Always look for buses going to Nasugbu -Batangas and advise them to drop you at Twin Lakes Hotel.
