



## Memorandum Circulars Issued During ECQ Period

EMB Memorandum Circular 2020-14	Interim Guidelines on Issuance of Special Permit to Transport (SPTT) for the Transport of Hazardous Waste within the Community Quarantine Period
EMB Memorandum Circular 2020-15	Addendum to the Interim Guidelines on Issuance of Special Permit to Transport (SPTT) for the Transportation of Hazardous Wastes within the Community Quarantine Period
EMB Memorandum Circular 2020-16	Amendment of the Interim Guidelines on Issuance of Special Permit to Transport (SPTT) for the Transportation of Hazardous Wastes within the Community Quarantine Period
EMB Memorandum Circular 2020-20	Provisional Guidelines on the Hazardous Wastes Management during the Extended Enhanced Community Quarantine Period

## **Highlights of the Issued Policies**

- EXEMPTION on travel ban or facilitation in passing through checkpoints.
- **SIMPLIFICATION** of procedures in securing permit to transport by registered transporters through online submission of required documents which are processed within five (5) days upon receipt of the application.
- **AUTOMATIC EXTENSION** of registrations for both transporter and TSD for sixty (60) days should it expire during the ECQ period.
- **SUSPENSION** of payment of permit fee that will only be collected once the ECQ has been lifted.
- Wearing of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) such as gloves, coverall, full face shield and mask/respirators for equivalent to level C PPEs must be provided to transporter's staff directly exposed in the collection of healthcare wastes.

### **Recent Directives**

#### Memorandum to all EMB Regional Offices dated 12 September 2022

- Approval of the request of the Department of Health (DOH) for **issuance of Special Permit to Transport (SPTT)** for infectious and pharmaceutical wastes generated from the *COVID-19 immunization program*
- For wastes **M501** and **M503** only
- Covers only those Center for Health Development/ Regional Offices (CHDs), and Provincial Health Offices (PHOs) identified in list provided by DOH
- The approval is valid until **31 December 2022.**

# Recent Policy Issuances

EMB MC 2020-19 | Clarificatory guidance on the issuance of Hazardous Waste Generator (HWG) Registration for mall or commercial building owners and clustered establishments

#### HIGHLIGHTS

Haz Waste Generators (HWG) Registration for Commercial Building Owners and Clustered Establishments

- Mall or building owners shall apply HWG ID
- Individual tenant **shall** apply its own HWG if the existing service agreement provides that its own wastes is handled by a third party service provider.
- Individual member establishments belonging to a <u>CLUSTER</u> are **NOT** required to register as HWG.
- The Approved CLUSTER with centralized storage facility SHALL:
  - ✓ register as TSD facility.
  - ✓ apply PTT for the transport of HW from the centralized storage facility to the TSD facility.

NOTE: PTT is **NOT** required for the transport of HW from individual member establishments to the centralized storage facility.

# Recent Policy Issuances

EMB MC 2021-03 | Guidance on the registration requirements for Category A Hazardous waste Treatment, Storage, Disposal (TSD) Facility

#### HIGHLIGHTS

Clarification on the Permitting Requirements for Registration as Category A TSD Facility

Category A TSD Facility are hazardous waste generators that will treat and dispose of their own wastes:

- Generators that own and operate the equipment which will treat their own generated wastes; and
- 2) Generators that will acquire the services of mobile treatment of hazardous wastes owned and operated by a third-party service provider.

# Recent Policy Issuances

EMB MC 2021-04 | Amendment on some provisions of DAO 2010-06: Guidelines on the use of alternative fuels and raw materials in cement kilns

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- Inclusion of the terms Non-Pathological Infectious Healthcare Wastes, Treated Non-Pathological
  Infectious Healthcare Wastes, and Flame Retardant Combustible Plastics such as Polybrominated
  Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE) and other- containing plastic wastes.
- Treated Non-pathological Infectious Healthcare Wastes are ALLOWED to be co-processed provided it
  meets the criteria indicated in Section 4 of DAO 2010-06.
- Clarification on the waste materials that are NOT acceptable for co-processing:
  - ✓ Pathological wastes
  - All WEEE except dismantled and segregated PBDE-containing plastic wastes
  - ✓ **Unsegregated municipal** solid wastes *except* those <u>segregated at source</u> and at any intermediate collection/ sorting station.

## Proposed Amendments to DAO 2013-22

- Integration of the Online Hazardous Waste Management System
- Inclusion of the four characteristics of hazardous wastes (Toxicity, Reactivity, Ignitability and Corrosivity)
- Further classification of wastes (D406, M501, M506, M507)
- Requirements for hazardous waste generator registration for malls or commercial building owners and clustered establishments
- Increase in storage time limit
- Maximum of 3 years validity for TSD Facility and HW Transporter registrations
- Definitions of TSD Categories A, B, and F
- Requirements for mobile treatment of wastes

## Proposed Amendments to DAO 2013-22

- Additions from the Technical Guidelines on the ESM of WEEE
- Exemption of importers of second-hand or used Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) for personal or official use by a company and not for commercial purposes
- Inclusion of slags for further recovery of various metals and granulated blast furnace (GBF) slag as an additive to the clinker under the category of Scrap Metals
- Export of Used Lead Acid Batteries (ULABs) and used oil (industrial and cooking oil) shall
   NOT be allowed






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# ONLINE HAZARDOUS WASTES MANAGEMENT PROCESS FLOW

# Pipeline Project

"Reduction of Unintentionally-produced Persistent Organic Pollutant (u-POPs) and Mercury through an environmentally-sound approach on healthcare wastes management in the Philippines (special focus on the pandemic)"

#### **Components:**

- Reduction of unintentionally produced POPs in the healthcare waste sector with special reference to the current pandemic.
- Management of mercury, mercury-added products (MAPs) and mercury wastes in the healthcare sector according to the Minamata Convention on Mercury and the Philippine National Action Plan for MAPs phase-out.
