In this global pandemic, PCAPI Region 4A Chapter is in full support to the world's campaign of a "new normal" with virtual connection and reduced direct contact. Businesses worldwide are affected but still saddled with the challenge and requirement to comply with environmental laws. To help the businesses in our country cope up with their environmental compliance, PCAPI R4A is now transitioning from its traditional pen and paper trainings and seminar to its brand new and upgraded virtual trainings.

The Pollution Control Association of the Philippines, Inc. Region IV-A will conduct an **Online "Accredited Basic Training Course for Pollution Control Officers"** on **May 7-11, 2024**, through **Microsoft Teams (MS Teams)**. Similar to all face-to-face PCAPI 4A trainings in the past, this Online Basic Training for PCOs is a 5-days immersive training but will be tailored in the MS Teams platform and delivered in real-time streaming. This will be presented by accomplished and powerful resource persons and facilitated by PCAPI 4A's dynamic Training Team composed of its Facilitators, Training Director and Secretariat who will guide the PCO Trainee in their 5-day virtual training experience.

**Course Title: Basic Training Course for
Pollution Control Officers (ON-LINE)**

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Capability building for new Pollution Control Officers (PCOs) to understand and implement the provisions of five (5) basic environmental regulations, environmental management and monitoring; environmental permitting, sampling and analysis; documentation and reporting; and the PCO responsibilities. We have carefully selected and tailored appropriate activities to help facilitate speaker-PCO and co-PCO interaction similar to that of face-to-face Training.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This training aims to develop the capacity of Pollution Control Officers (PCOs) in performing their functions, duties and responsibilities using accelerated learning techniques based on actual experiences and best practices.

Specifically, at the end of the 40 hours training, the participant shall have:

- Discussed climate change and be able to relate how a PCO can contribute to the mitigation and adaptation measures, within and beyond the frameworks of the Philippine Agenda on Sustainable Development, and the environmental regulations of the country;
- Discussed the salient features and requirements of relevant laws on environment such as PD 1586, RA 9003, 6969, 9275, 8749 and the implementing rules and regulations (IRRs); and be able to identify the violations raised to the Pollution Adjudication Board;
- Identify ALL compliance requirements of environmental laws, specific to their operations and able to prepare basic for the application of required environmental permits;
- Discussed the do's and don'ts of environmental sampling and have analyzed sample data;
- Identified possible causes of environmental incidents and enumerate the process of incident investigation;
- Articulated the requirements in the accreditation of PCOs per DAO 2014-02, and the PCO roles, functions, and value orientation;
- Done an exercise on the preparation of SMR and CMR; and
- Prepared a draft EMP and EMoP

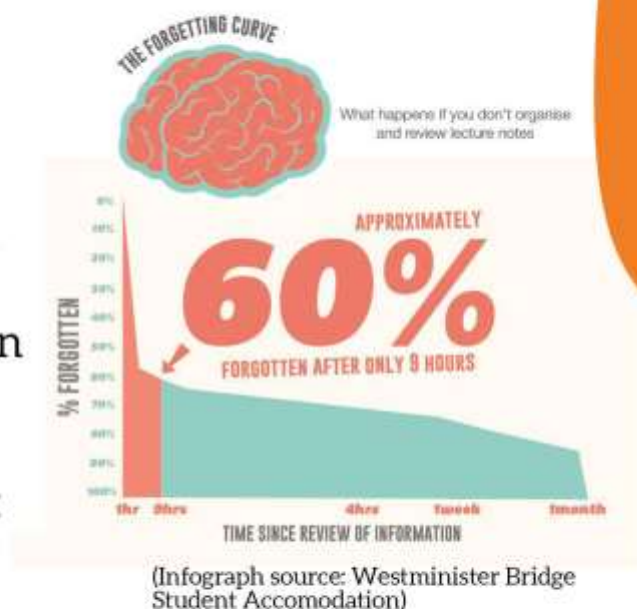
